
REMOVE THAT URINARY CATHETER!



Urinary Catheters Increase:

- Likelihood of Infection
- Patient Discomfort
- Antibiotic Use
- Length of Stay
- Cost

* Patients with urinary catheters tend to stay in bed, making them more immobile, and increasing their risk of skin breakdown

Urinary Catheters ARE Indicated for:

- ☑ Acute urinary retention or obstruction
- ☑ Perioperative use in selected surgeries
- Assist healing of perineal and sacral wounds in incontinent patients
- ☑ Hospice /comfort care/ palliative care
- ☑ Required immobilization for trauma or surgery
- $\ensuremath{\boxtimes}$ Chronic indwelling urinary catheter on admission

Foley Catheters are *NOT* indicated for:

- Urine output monitoring OUTSIDE intensive care
- Incontinence (place on toileting routine, change frequently)
- Prolonged postoperative use
- Patients transferred from intensive care to general units
- Morbid obesity
- Immobility (turn patient q 2 hours, up in chair)
- Confusion or dementia
